Elections – March 13, 2007 (8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.)

Business Meeting – March 17, 2007 (9:00 a.m.)

TO: The inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey, in the County of Cheshire, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Ernest J. Pratt Auditorium in said Jaffrey on Tuesday, the 13th of March, 2007 at eight o'clock in the forenoon (polls close at 7:00 p.m.) to vote for the town officers and to act on other questions as required by law to be decided by official ballot. Pursuant to RSA 39:2a and the vote of the Town at the adjourned session of Town Meeting on March 13, 1979 and the Town Meeting on March 13, 1993, the business portion of the meeting will be recessed until nine o'clock in the forenoon, Saturday, March 17th, 2007, at which time the Town will act on all subjects described in the following Warrant Articles except those requiring action by official ballot:

Art. 1. To choose the following Town Officers: (by Official Ballot)

Selectman - one person for three-year term- Frank W. Sterling, Jr
Trustee of Trust Funds - one person for three-year term- Frank Mieso
Library Trustee - one person for three-year term- Carolyn Jalbert
Library Trustee – one person for three-year term- Elizabeth Shea

Art. 2. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following amendments to the Jaffrey Zoning Ordinances, as proposed by the Jaffrey Planning Board, to be voted on by Official Ballot: (The exact text, and related material, of each of these proposed changes is available at the Town Clerk's office and at the polling place.)

1. Are you in favor of Amendment #1 to the Jaffrey Land Use Plan as proposed by the Planning Board? This amendment rewrites the zoning

2. description of General Business (from Ellison Street to Cheshire Pond), Industrial District (Tack Shop) and Residence B (South).

Yes - 682 No - 178

3. Are you in favor of Amendment #2 to the Jaffrey Land Use Plan as proposed by the Planning Board? This amendment defines land which is undevelopable, such as wetlands and slopes greater than 25% and land subject to specific requirements, such as land in the Shoreland Protective Zone.

Yes – 659 No - 216

4. Are you in favor of Amendment #3 changing the Subdivision Regulations as proposed by the Planning Board? This amendment requires applicants for major subdivisions (4 or more lots) to request a meeting with the Planning Board to discuss a proposal in conceptual form and in general terms.

Yes – 756 No - 125

5. Are you in favor of Amendment #4 to the Land Use Plan which adds the following wording?

The term condominium refers to a form of ownership and as such condominiums are authorized for all districts of the Town.

Yes – 517 No - 354

Recessed until March 24, 2007, 9:00am

(Due to inclement weather, meeting was postponed)

The meeting was called to order, and the attendants were asked to stand as the Boy Scouts from Troop 33 Nathan Bailey and Garrett Bergeron presented the colors and Michael Sisk led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. After which Mr. Tieger, (the moderator), asked everyone to remain standing as he read the following:

“Once again we come together again as is our tradition to help guide and decide the business of the Town for the coming year. We are citizens with different philosophies and options and yet we are united in our common purpose – the continuing commitment to the well being of this wonderful town, which we are so fortunate to call home.

We come with heavy hearts and confused minds, as we observe world events. For some of us this anxiety is intensified as our sons and daughters, husbands and wives, and those of our friends are called to the service of their country. Please know that our thoughts and prayers are with them, and with you, in these most difficult times. We also respect and understand the rights of those with differing opinions and we sympathize with them in their anguish. Above all we are reminded again of how fortunate we are to live in the United States of America where the rights of all are respected.

As we reflect on the losses our community has endured during the past year we re-affirm in silence to those men and women of what has been rightfully called the Greatest Generation for their complete lack of selfishness, their commitment to their nation. Our freedom is the result of them and their sacrifices.

So let us listen and question, let us speak and debate with civility and respect, let us learn from others even as we put forth our own views, and when the meeting is over let us leave here with the knowledge that the tradition of our Jaffrey Town Meeting, and our role of participation in it, remains stronger than ever. Please join me in a few moments of silent meditation and reflection.”

Mr. Tieger then welcomed everyone to the meeting. Mr. Tieger introduced the front tables where the Selectmen, Acting Town Manager, Department Heads, Town Clerk and Budget Committee Chairman sat.

Mr. Tieger said that Assistant Moderator Phil Cournoyer would be moderating a few of the articles today and that he would also be over seeing the Ballot boxes when the polls were open for secret ballot articles.

Mr. Tieger introduced the department heads, their representatives and the State Representatives that were attending the meeting. Mr. Tieger

mentioned that the State Representatives would be able after the meeting for questions and concerns.

Mr. Tieger thanked Steve Rigopoulos for the free lettering on the banner that was at O'Brien's restaurant. He also thanked Robert and Eileen Beaven from O'Briens for allowing the banner to be hung outside their establishment.

Mr. Tieger asked everyone to take note of a questionnaire that Rob Stephenson put together about town meeting and asked folks to consider filling it out and putting into the box in the back of the auditorium.

Mr. Tieger thanked TEAM Jaffrey for providing refreshments.

Mr. Tieger recognized Chairman of the Board of Selectmen, Frank Sterling. Frank Sterling then offered the following resolutions:

Now, therefore, be it resolved and proclaimed in Town Meeting convened March 24, 2007, that the Town of Jaffrey wishes to express our thanks and sincere gratitude and that this expression of our thanks be made a part of the official record of this meeting.”

The resolutions were accepted by acclamation.

Mr. Tieger went over the ground rules for the meeting. He said that the only non-residents recognized to speak were Town Council, Acting Town Manager, Acting Director of Public Works, a representative from Wright Pierce Engineering, and a representative from Southwest Community Services. And he also mentioned that Articles 3 & 4 were “ballot” vote articles.

Mr. Tieger then read the following letter:

“Dear Friends,

Marc Tieger gave me this great opportunity to write a quick note to say hello to everyone at the 2007 Town Meeting. I know you’ve got a lot of issues to debate on the warrant so I won’t keep you long, but I would most like to pass on a very heartfelt thank you to all of you who have been so supportive of my family and me while I have been gone. For those of you who have been in a similar situation, whether in the military or some other profession which takes you away from home for an extended period of time you know the pain of leaving and thinking of your family and friends back home. When you have young children it seems especially painful, but also quite gratifying to know there are so many willing to help out in the care of my family. Jaffrey is full of so many kind, loving and generous people. Please accept my sincere thanks for your kindness.

I would especially like to thank the three Selectmen for their support...I guess it helps that they are all Army veterans themselves, and therefore understand my obligation to the Army, but as individuals they are extraordinarily kind and supportive gentlemen. Also, a special thank you

to Randy Heglin for his willingness to fill in for me while I'm away and to the rest of my fellow Jaffrey employees for their support.

The other day I was the sole US Army representative at the City Council meeting in Sadr City. For those of you following the situation in Baghdad you know that Sadr City is in the heart of this battle between Sunnis and Shias. There were about 30 councilmen present and the Chairman offered me an opportunity to speak. I stood and looked at their faces and while we are making progress in this part of Baghdad, the looks I got were not necessarily friendly. Heck, I'd rather have a discussion on leasing equipment with Bill Driscoll than to deal with these guys again. Talk about a tough crowd!! Anyway, it was another very unique opportunity that I have experienced while serving here in Iraq. I've had many and with six months left I'm sure I'll have many more, but I can't wait to get home and be able to see all of you again.

Be grateful for your opportunity to participate in a democracy. There are many people I have met here in Iraq that would love the chance to live through a Town Meeting.

Thank you again for your support!

At this time Owen Houghton asked for a “Point of Order” and challenged the moderator; the challenge was that according to “Roberts Rules” that once a question is moved discussion is ended. But Mr. Tieger (as is his tradition) likes fairness to all and if the question is moved he allows the list of those recognized to speak to do so and then entertains the motion to move.

A few people then spoke in support of what has been traditionally been done for the last 17+ years. A voice vote was taken and it was decided that tradition would continue.

Mr. Tieger proposed to waive reading of the Warrant in its entirety. It was so moved and seconded.

Mr. Tieger then read the results from Tuesday's election.

Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eighteen Million Dollars (\$18,000,000) (gross budget) for the construction of a wastewater treatment plant and sewer system including any other costs related thereto, and for related infrastructure improvements, as ordered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. and to authorize the issuance of not more than Eighteen Million Dollars (\$18,000,000) of bonds and notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA 33 et. seq.), as amended, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to issue, negotiate, sell and deliver such bonds or notes, and to determine the rate of interest thereon and the maturity and other terms thereof, and to take any other action the Board deems appropriate to effectuate the sale and/or issuance of said bonds and to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, obtain and accept federal, state or other aid, if any, which may become available for said project and to comply with all laws applicable to this project; further, without impairing the status of this bond as a general obligation bond of the Town, it is the intention and expectation of the Selectmen that debt service on this bond will be paid 2/3rd by Sewer User Fees and 1/3rd by General Tax Revenue. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee. 2/3 Ballot Vote Required.

So moved and seconded. Selectman Frank Sterling moved and then moved to amend the dollar amount to “\$12,840,840.00 – Twelve Million Eight Hundred Forty Thousand, Eight Hundred Forty Dollars” because the bid for the project came in lower than what was expected. With no discussion the amended dollar amount was moved to a vote- passed.

Frank Sterling then addressed the article, as amended. Vic Krea from Wright Pierce was recognized to address the article in which he did an overview of the costs, effluent limits, affordability, treatment, discharge, alternative energy and financing.

After some lively discussion, questions and comments the polls were open.

The voters were instructed to use the “A” ballot.

The polls were declared open at 10:40 for one hour.

The results were as follows:

Yes – 194 (84.3%) No – 36 (15.7%)

The article passed with the required 2/3 majority vote.

Art. 4. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

Art.14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 and to be deposited into the Cemetery Trees Trust Fund created in 2007. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

Pursuant to RSA 39:2a and the vote of the Town at the adjourned session of Town Meeting on March 13, 1979 and the Town Meeting on March 13, 1993, the business portion of the meeting will be recessed until nine o'clock in the forenoon, Saturday, March 15th, 2008, at the Ernest J. Pratt Auditorium in Jaffrey, at which time the Town will act on all subjects described in the following Warrant Articles except those requiring action by official ballot:

Art. 1. To choose the following Town Officers: (by Official Ballot)

Selectman - one person for three-year term
Trustee of Trust Funds - one person for three-year term
Library Trustee - one person for three-year term
Supervisor of the Checklist – one person for six-year term
Moderator – one person for two-year term
Town Clerk – one person for three-year term
Treasurer – one person for three-year term

Art. 2. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following amendments to the Jaffrey Zoning Ordinances, as proposed by the Jaffrey Planning Board, to be voted on by Official Ballot: (The exact text, and related material, of each of these proposed changes is available at the Town Clerk's office and at the polling place.)

1. Are you in favor of Amendment #1 to the Jaffrey Land Use Plan as proposed by the Planning Board? This amendment proposes to change the title of the “Jaffrey Land Use Plan” to the “Jaffrey Zoning Ordinances”.

LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: The Jaffrey Land Use Plan is in fact the compilation of the Town’s zoning ordinances. This change in title is more descriptive of the document and helps to eliminate potential confusion.

2. Are you in favor of Amendment #2 to the Jaffrey Land Use Plan as proposed by the Planning Board? This Amendment deletes Para 4.26C of the Land Use Plan, which states that undevelopable land will not be considered in calculating density requirements.

LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: Town Counsel has recommended that this paragraph be deleted. Deleting the paragraph more accurately describes the current ordinance guidelines as enforced.

3. Are you in favor of Amendment #3 to the Land Use Plan as proposed by the Planning Board? This amendment establishes the Mountain Zone as its own district (vs. the current overlay to the Rural Zone) and simplifies/clarifies the requirements to provide differentiation with the existing Rural Zone.

LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: This proposal maintains the current geographic boundaries, but establishes the Mountain Zone as its own zoning district. It establishes a 3 acre minimum lot size, restricts dwellings to detached single-family with 60’ minimum separation, minimizes Special Exceptions and modifies OSDP density bonuses to those applicable for contiguous open space and for open space which exceeds the minimum.

4. Are you in favor of Amendment #4 to the Land Use Plan as proposed by the Planning Board? This amendment revises the Open Space Development Plan (OSDP) ordinance to encourage its use and better define its requirements.

LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: This proposal is intended to simplify the current ordinance by making the Planning Board the administrator of this and other Innovative Land Use Plans. Further, this amendment establishes a formula-based density calculation, better defines open space requirements, adopts a sliding scale bonus system, requires OSDP for all subdivisions on parcels over 20 acres and adopts a minimum 10 acre lot size for an OSDP. Also included is a Conditional Use Permit which provides for instances where the provisions may not apply.

5. Are you in favor of updating the Floodplain Ordinance with revisions as proposed by the National Flood Insurance Program (OEP)?

LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: The National Flood Insurance Program audited the Town of Jaffrey’s Floodplain Ordinance and identified changes requiring any development in the flood hazard area to obtain an appropriate permit and to further require that all available data be used in identifying a potential encroachment in the hazard area.

Art. 3. That all reports submitted by Town Officers be accepted as read and as printed in the Town Report.

LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: The purpose of this article to accept all reports as printed in the Town Report, and to take the opportunity to discuss them if anyone has a question.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to approve the cost items included in the collective bargaining agreement reached between the Town and the Public Works Union, AFSCME Local 2973 that calls for the following increase in salaries and benefits, this amount is included in Article 8. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This article allows for the continuation of the contract as agreed to by the Town and the Public Works Union and as approved at 2007 Town Meeting (Article 7) and the payment of the cost items included therein. Art. 5. Shall the Town, if Article 4 is defeated, authorize the governing body to call one special meeting, at its option, to address Article 4 cost items only?

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This article is a requirement to allow the Town to delegate authority to the Selectmen to call one special town meeting to reconsider Article 4, should it fail. If Article 4 passes then this article is passed over.

Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to approve the cost items included in the collective bargaining agreement reached between the Town and the Police Union, AFSCME Local 3657, that calls for the following increase in salaries and benefits, this amount is included in Article 8. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This article allows for the continuation of the contract as agreed to by the Town and the Police Union and they payment of cost items included therein.

Art. 7. Shall the Town, if Article 6 is defeated, authorize the governing body to call one special meeting, at its option, to address Article 6 cost items only?

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This article is a requirement to allow the Town to delegate authority to the Selectmen to call one special town meeting to reconsider Article 6, should it fail. If Article 6 passes then this article is passed over.

Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,975,714 for general municipal operations. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is the article that provides the funds necessary to operate the Town on an annual basis. This article includes all salaries, maintenance, supplies and programs which are funded and operated by the Town.

Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$45,000, and to deposit said sum into the capital reserve fund established in 2002 under RSA 35:1, for the purpose of conducting a Town wide property revaluation. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: A Capital Reserve Fund is like a savings account for future expenditures. By putting a portion of the anticipated cost aside on a regular basis, a big jump in the tax rate or the need to borrow can be avoided. State Law requires that a revaluation be completed every 5 years and the Town's last revaluation was completed in 2005. The current balance of this reserve fund as of December 31, 2007 is \$47,132.39.

Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125,000 for the purpose of purchasing a new sidewalk plow. The purchase will be funded \$45,000 from the Highway Capital Reserve, \$40,000 from the Downtown TIDF and \$40,000 from the General Fund. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This will replace the town's ten year old sidewalk plow which is experiencing frequent breakdowns due to its advanced age. The purchase will be funded with \$40,000 from the Downtown TIDF, \$45,000 from the Highway Capital Reserve Fund and \$40,000 from the General Fund.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 for the purpose of purchasing and installing a new electrical back up generator for the Fire Department. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: This will replace the emergency generator at the fire station. The existing generator is more than 40 years old and is no longer reliable. The fire station is the Town’s emergency operations center and maintenance of power at this facility is a priority.

Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of no more than \$70,000 for the purpose of acquiring a parcel of land (Map 239, Lot 213), consisting of approximately 1 acre, to complete the ball field complex and as the site for a possible community center location in the future, and for costs associated with the purchase including surveys, closing costs and legal costs and other such costs necessary to complete the purchase. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: This will allow the Town to purchase state-owned property adjacent to the new community ball field. The purchase and associated costs will be funded with \$35,000 from the Downtown TIFD and \$35,000 from the General Fund.

Art.13. To see if the Town will vote to ratify the expenditure of up to \$160,000 for the acquisition of a conservation/water quality easement and for associated costs with the purchase. Said costs to include due diligence studies, surveys, appraisal, closing costs, legal fees and other such costs necessary to complete the purchase, by negotiated purchase, gift or otherwise, as substantiated by an independent third party appraisal using funds from the existing Conservation Fund and/or grants and/or private contributions, upon certain property referred to as “Grey Goose Farmland” with two accesses both off Squantum Road, consisting of 56 acres more or less, and being shown on Assessor’s Map 242 as Lots 57.3 (31+/- acres) and 57.4 (25+/- acres), to be conveyed to the Town of Jaffrey in accordance with New Hampshire Chapter 36-A and other relevant New Hampshire statutes relating to Conservation, to be under the care, custody, management and control of the Jaffrey Conservation Commission for the purpose of protecting down gradient and subsurface water supplies, protection of agricultural soils, conservation of other natural resources including wildlife habitat and potential public access for passive recreation, and other uses consistent with the conservation, Submitted by the Conservation Commission. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: The purchase of this easement is to protect the water quality of the subsurface aquifer and down gradient public wells. This is an advisory vote as the Conservation Commission has the legal authority to purchase easements, with the approval of the Board of Selectmen (RSA 36-A:4), for conservation purposes without approval from the Town Meeting. The funds for the purchase of the Conservation / Water Quality easement shall come from the existing Conservation Fund and will have no additional impact on the tax rate.

Art.14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 and to be deposited into the Cemetery Trees Trust Fund created in 2007. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: The Cemetery Trust Fund was created in 2007 and its purpose is to set aside funds for the removal of trees in the Town's cemeteries. The Cemetery Committee has identified several large trees which need to be removed as they pose a threat to historic gravestones. The cost for removal will be very expensive and the fund has been established for these expenditures. A separate Fund has also set up to accept private donations, which so far have totaled \$500. The current balance in the public Trust Fund as of December 31, 2007 is \$5,016.42. The private and public funds are accounted for separately by the Trustees.

Art.15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 to be deposited into the Gravestone Restoration Trust Fund established in 2000. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: The Gravestone Restoration fund, created in 2000, is used to repair and maintain gravestones in Jaffrey's cemeteries that have been damaged or vandalized, specifically in those instances where no family member can be found to assume responsibility. Work is generally done in the fall by a professional monument company. Volunteers do some stone straightening as required. Money was last added to the fund in

2005 (\$500). The current balance in the Trust Fund as of December 31, 2007 is \$86.19.

Art.16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to be deposited into the Meeting House Trust Fund established in 1991. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: The cost of major repairs and maintenance of the historic Meeting House (painting, roofing, etc.) are financed by income from rentals and occasional donations. The Meeting House Trust Fund was created in 1999 and is overseen by the Trustees of Trust Funds. Various amounts have been placed in the fund over the years but none since 1999. It seems prudent to add a modest amount in preparation for future expenses. The current balance in the Trust Fund as of December 31, 2007 is \$22,643.31.

Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article 12 of the 1998 Town Meeting to provide that the Town Clock fund is to be utilized for the maintenance and repair of both Town Clocks. (2/3 vote is required). Recommended by Selectmen.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This fund was created in 1998 specifically to support the Town Clock in the tower of the Cutler Memorial Building in downtown. The second Town Clock is in the Meeting House tower. Both clocks are inspected and serviced twice a year. The fees for inspection and service have been paid out of two funds, this one and the Meeting House Fund. Because of the sizable balance in this fund (nearly \$20,000) it is recommended to amend the language to allow expenses for both clocks to be covered from this fund. A 2/3 vote is required.

Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Stone Arch Bridge Tax Increment Finance District Financing Plan.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: The Stone Arch Bridge TIFD is located mostly along Route 202 from D.D. Bean's and along Old Sharon Road. The TIFD funds the debt on the Old Sharon Road

bridge construction in 2002 and will be funding design work for extension of the water main. It has been long recognized that water service for both domestic use and fire protection is desired and necessary. The proposed funding is to pay for the necessary survey and design of the water extension which is required by the NHDES and development of specifications suitable for bid. The cost for this work is \$60,000.

Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Downtown Tax Increment Finance District Financing Plan.

LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: The Downtown TIFD covers all of the downtown area. It funds a contribution to TEAM Jaffrey to support their efforts, the bond for purchase of the site of the new community ball field and completion of the Downtown traffic mitigation study. It is proposed to fund a portion of the new sidewalk plow, partial funding of the purchase of the state property adjacent to the new ball field and design work on the Main Street dam. On October 3, 2007 the Town received a “Letter of Deficiency from the NHDES which identified 18 deficiencies with the dam. The work proposed this year are developing plans and specifications to remedy physical deficiencies in addition to development and updating an emergency action plan and operations and maintenance plan along with confirmation of the dam hazard classification in light of the recent conversion of the mill into residential apartments and condominiums.

Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept as a town roadway (Class V) the construction and completion of approximately 1300 feet of Perry Road (Clover Farms Subdivision) once all conditions of the Town, its Boards and Departments have been satisfied. Approved by the Planning Board on January 10, 2006, and as built to Town specifications at no cost to the Town of Jaffrey. Submitted by Board of Selectmen.

LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: One of the ways for a new road to become a public road is that the Town Meeting must decide to “accept” the road after it has been “dedicated” to the Town. It must

meet all Town road construction specifications as determined by the Planning Board and Public Works Department. The developer of the subdivision has submitted as-built plans of the work which are currently being reviewed and verified by the Department of Public Works.

Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to rescind Article 21 of the 1987 Annual Town Meeting regarding the discharge of firearms in the vicinity of Cheshire Pond. Recommended by the Selectmen.

LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: Article 21 of 1987 Annual Town Meeting prohibited the discharge of firearms within 1500 feet of an occupied dwelling surrounding the area known as “Cheshire Pond”. Town Counsel has informed us that this ordinance is contrary to RSA 159.26 which prohibits municipalities from regulating the “sale, purchase, ownership, use, possession, transportation, or other matters pertaining to fire arms”, and consequently cannot be enforced.

Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article 23 of the 1993 Annual Town Meeting to authorize that any proceeds which accrue from forest management on town-owned property shall be apportioned 50% to the Conservation Fund and 50% to the Town’s General Fund, Enterprise Fund or Special Revenue Fund. This amendment shall expire on December 31, 2018, at which time, going forward, in accordance with Article 23 of the 1993 Annual Town Meeting, all revenues from forest management on Town property shall be placed in the Conservation Fund. Recommended by the Selectmen. Accepted by the Conservation Commission.

LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: This article suspends, for a period of ten years; the provisions of Article 23 of the 1993 Annual Town Meeting, which provides that all revenues from forest management activities on Town property are placed in the Conservation Fund. With this article revenues from forest management activities will be apportioned 50% to the Conservation Fund and 50% to the General Fund through December 31, 2018.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is an article that appears annually and provides a community benefit to the residents of Jaffrey and the region.

Art. 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,163 for Monadnock Family Services, or take any other action relating thereto. Submitted by Petition. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article which we receive annually and which provides a community benefit to the residents of Jaffrey and the region.

Art. 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$17,000 to support HCS – Home Healthcare, Hospice and Community Services to support the continuance of visiting nursing services being provided to the residents of Jaffrey. Submitted by Petition. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article that we receive annually and which provides a community benefit to the residents of Jaffrey and the region.

Art. 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to help support the work of The Community Kitchen, Inc. in Keene, NH. Submitted by Petition. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee

Submitted by Petition. Recommended by the Selectmen. Not recommended by the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article that we receive annually which provides a community service to residents of Jaffrey and the region.

Art. 29. To See if the Town will vote to approve the following resolution to be forwarded to our elected officials at the local and state levels: Resolved: We the citizens of Jaffrey, NH believe in a New Hampshire that is just and fair. State leaders who take a pledge for no new taxes perpetuate higher and higher property taxes. We call on our State Representatives, our State Senator and our Governor to reject the "Pledge", have an open discussion covering all options, and adopt a revenue system that lowers property taxes. Submitted by petition.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is an advisory article and holds no force under the law.

**Indefinite Delegation of Authority
by the Town to
The Board of Selectmen and The Library Trustees**

Prior to 1999, a number of articles appeared on the Town Warrant each year delegating specific powers to the Board of Selectmen and the Library Trustees. These articles are usually referred to as “boilerplate articles.” During the 1999 annual meeting, Jaffrey’s citizens voted (Articles 32-38) to “authorize indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority” the Selectmen and the Library Trustees to undertake various actions and, therefore, to no longer include these articles on future Town Meeting Warrants. The Town of Jaffrey now has seven such warrant articles, which are listed below for your reference:

1) ACCEPTANCE OF GRANTS

Shall the Town accept the provisions of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated (RSA) 31:95-b, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the Selectmen to apply for, accept, and expend without further action by the Town Meeting, unanticipated money from federal, state, or other governmental agencies or a private source that becomes available during the year?

2) ACCEPTANCE OF GRANTS BY LIBRARIES

Shall the Town accept the provisions of NH RSA 202-A:4-c, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the Library Trustees to apply for, accept, and expend without further action by the Town Meeting, unanticipated money from a federal, state, or other governmental unit or a private source that becomes available during the year?

3) TAX ANTICIPATION NOTES

Shall the Town accept the provisions of NH RSA 33:7, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the Selectmen to issue tax anticipation notes?

4) ACCEPTANCE OF GIFTS, LEGACIES, AND DEVICES

Shall the Town accept the provisions of NH RSA 31:19, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the Selectmen to accept on behalf of the Town gifts, legacies, and devises made to the Town in trust for any public purpose, as permitted by this statute?

5) ACCEPTANCE OF GIFTS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY

Shall the Town adopt the provisions of NH RSA 31:95-e, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the Selectmen to accept gifts of personal property that may be offered to the Town for any public purpose? The Selectmen must hold a public hearing before accepting such a gift, and the acceptance shall not bind the Town to raise, appropriate, or expend any public funds for the operation, maintenance, repair, or replacement of such equipment.

6) ACCEPTANCE OF GIFTS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY BY LIBRARIES

Shall the Town adopt the provisions of NH RSA 202-A:4-d, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the Library Trustees to accept gifts of personal property that may be offered to the Library for any purpose; provided, however, that no acceptance of personal property by the Library Trustees shall be deemed to bind the Town or the Library Trustees to raise, appropriate, or expend any public funds for the operation, maintenance, repair, or replacement of such personal property?

7) TRANSFER OF TAX LIENS AND SALE OF TAX DEED PROPERTY

Shall the Town adopt the provisions of NH RSA 80:80, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the Selectmen to dispose of property acquired by Tax Deed by either conveying said property back to its original owner(s) for consideration equal to all associated unpaid

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Selectmen
Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, business-type activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire as of and for the year ended December 31, 2006, which collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Town's management. Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. 

Many challenges faced the town of Jaffrey in 2007 but much was achieved in terms of problems that have faced Jaffrey for many years.

At Town Meeting in March after the general budget was passed for all departments, the citizens were presented with a Warrant Article which would allow the town to bond the construction of an Advanced Waste Water Treatment plant. Jaffrey had been under an administrative order for over 10 years from the Environmental Protective Agency and the State of New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services to build such a facility.

We had failed in the past to receive a 2/3 majority vote at Town Meeting. In 2007, after several expensive studies and much input from citizens who knew the high cost of this project, we were finally successful in receiving the 2/3 majority vote necessary to pass the article. On that day, the Board of Selectmen pledged to apply for all available funds to help lessen the financial burden on our citizens. As of this date, we have received Federal Funding of \$2.6 million through the combined efforts of Senators John Sununu, Judd Gregg, Congressman Paul Hodes, Department of Public Works Head Randall Heglin, Town Engineer Doug Starr and staff from our consultants Wright Pierce, Inc. Additional funding from the State of New Hampshire promises to bring the final cost of this project to well below half of the original cost estimate of \$18 million. Completion of this Advanced Treatment System is expected to be on schedule for May 2009.

Another Warrant Article at our March Town Meeting enabled the Selectmen to purchase a tract of land that showed promise of being a long sought-after third municipal water source. After additional testing for quality and volume, the selectmen purchased this land and we believe this is the answer to more than 20 years of searching for our third municipal well. Future costs to bring this well on line will have to be addressed; however, it is ideally located near an existing water main and utilities.

With the resignation of former Police Chief Martin Dunn in the spring of 2007, the Board of Selectmen and Acting Town Manager was mandated the task of hiring a new Police Chief. After much deliberation, it was with pleasure that we offered the position to Jaffrey Police Lt. William Oswalt,

who started with the JPD as a part-time officer and had worked his way up through the ranks over the years. He accepted the position in July, has done a terrific job and we hope that he will serve as Jaffrey's Police Chief for many years to come.

Another challenge our town faced in 2007 was mentioned in the 2006 Selectmen's Report. Our Town Manager, Jonathan Sistare, who had been deployed to Iraq, submitted his resignation as Town Manager upon his return from service to accept a similar position in Salem, New Hampshire. However, our town continued in the capable hands of Randall Heglin who filled in during Jonathan's absence. Randy did an outstanding job in this position and we owe him a debt of gratitude for coming to Jaffrey's rescue in a difficult time.

A nationwide search for a new Town Manager was launched in the Fall of the year. Out of the many applications that were received, ten candidates were chosen to be interviewed by a selection committee appointed by the Board. The names of two finalists were submitted to the Selectmen and Michael Hartman was selected to be the first new Town Manager for Jaffrey in over fourteen years. Michael started on November 1st, 2007, after having spent over twenty years in similar positions throughout New England. We welcome Mike to Jaffrey and are confident that he is a capable Town Manager and will do an outstanding job for our town.

In conclusion, 2007 was a very challenging year for the Board, but we take pride in our accomplishments this year and believe Jaffrey is in a better position to look to the future in 2008.

Thanks, too, to the Jaffrey Chamber of Commerce. With three elections remaining I would be remiss if I didn't extend my thanks to our dedicated crew of volunteer election officials, the Supervisors of the Checklist, to our Town Clerk Maria Chamberlain, and to Citizen Extraordinaire Rob Stephenson. All of you have contributed to helping foster and enhance the proper conduct of our democratic election process and our Town Meeting and, on behalf of the Town of Jaffrey, I thank you.

THE CEMETERY COMMITTEE was established in 1991 to advise the Town on the operation, maintenance and preservation of Jaffrey's public cemeteries: Conant, The Old Burying Ground, Cutter, Cutter Extension and Phillips-Heil (also the inactive cemeteries, Village and Smallpox). It is composed of representatives of the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Historical Society, Cournoyer Funeral Home, the Board of Selectmen and three appointed Members at Large. Town employees Randy Heglin, Rick Forcier and Peachie Chalke assist the Committee in its work.

During 2007 the Committee met eight times with Town staff to discuss operation, budget and maintenance issues, to participate in work sessions or to undertake inspections and cleanups. Each cemetery is overseen by a member of the Committee.



This oversight involves inspecting the cemetery from time to time and reporting on conditions and problems at Committee meetings.

At the 2007 Town Meeting, an article to establish a Cemetery Trees Fund with an initial appropriation of \$5,000 was

passed overwhelmingly. A similar article is expected this year. Private tax-deductible donations are very welcomed; to date a total of \$500 has been received.

In the Fall, resetting and straightening of head- and footstones and lot curbing and some stone repair in the Old Burying Ground, Cutter and Conant Cemeteries was undertaken by the Kaufhold Family Memorials & Stone Works of Peterborough. Additional stone straightening was also done by volunteers.

Phase II of the volunteer effort of restoring the iron fencing surrounding John Conant's grave at the cemetery named for him was undertaken by members of the Committee and Town staff. Three sections were scraped and painted. With luck this project will be completed in another two years. Anyone wishing to help out for a two- or three-hour work session should contact a member of the Committee. (The photo shows volunteers Paul St. Pierre, Doug Starr and Cynthia Hamilton working on the fence.)

Gravesites in the first section of Cutter Cemetery Extension became available for sale in 2007. Nine lots have been sold and one burial—the first—has occurred and the first monument erected.

On November 29th the Committee and Public Works staff visited all cemeteries and removed all unauthorized materials from gravesites. This was preceded by newspaper advertisements and signs posted at each cemetery. This is now done annually after October 31st.

Residents and lot owners are reminded that the Town's Cemetery Rules & Regulations and A Guide to the Public Cemeteries of Jaffrey are available from the Department of Public Works and on the Town website at <http://town.jaffrey.nh.us>.

During 2007 the Town lost its dedicated and long-time Cemetery Committee member Priscilla Palmer. Her participation will be missed.

The Committee looks forward in 2008 to 1) improving cemetery record keeping including computerization; 2) continuing the restoration of the iron fencing around John Conant's grave; and 3) finding ways and means to remove several aged trees posing a hazard in the Old Burying Ground and to maintain and replace trees in the Town's other cemeteries.

Report of The Community Center Committee

This year, the Community Center Committee took one important step toward its goal.

Thanks to financial support from the Town and from community businesses, and 600 hours of volunteer work, the Community Center Ball Park was built.

One Fall weekend, young and old joined together and dug ditches, laid out the bases and rolled sod to make the most beautiful ball field any community would desire. We are grateful to all the businesses and individuals who donated their time and equipment and to the moms and local restaurants who provided refreshments. Truly, this was a community effort!

Through the State's Young Architect Contest, we now have design plans developed by a Conant graduate, Michael McKeown. Michael's design reflects the culture and beauty of Jaffrey. If you have not yet seen the design, we will have it on display at Town Meeting.

We have run into a problem with this project. It seems that a little less than an acre of the property on which the Center hopes to be built, belongs to the State. The State wants us to buy the property for approximately \$65,000. Selectmen Clay Hollister and Representatives Steve Pelkey and Jim Hunt have tried hard to help us out, but it seems the State will not budge. As a result, The Committee hopes the Town will once again support us at Town Meeting and allow us to purchase this land.

The Committee will continue to search for grants and to hold fundraisers to further support our community center project. This Center will be for everyone in the community. It will be a safe haven for children after school, as well as a place for all community members to join together to talk and play, and to seek support from other community members and organizations. We hope you will join with us in this most needed project.

Report of the Conservation Commission

The Conservation Commission was established in accordance with Revised Statutes Annotated (RSA) 36-A for the proper use and protection of Jaffrey's natural resources and watersheds. The Commission provides a focal point within the Town and town government for environmental concerns, joined in 2007 by the new Energy Committee. The Commission may advise the Planning Board and other local bodies on conservation matters. The Commission may act more directly to protect natural resources by acquiring land, either outright or through easements, with the approval of the Selectmen. The Commission may then manage these conservation areas. The Commission also manages designated Town forests. 2007 was a busy year for the Jaffrey Commission, highlighted by several key initiatives. Much was accomplished; but completion of a Natural Resources Inventory remains an important piece of unfinished business.

NATURAL RESOURCES INVENTORY (NRI)

NRIs are the empirical foundation for much land-use decision making, and all conservation commissions in New Hampshire are mandated to produce one.

After repeated attempts to produce an NRI in-house, the Commission has decided to hire an environmental firm to complete the mapping and produce the final product in dialogue with the Commission. This turns out to be a common practice, as many commissions – ours included -- lack manpower with the time and skills required to produce a quality document. The services provided will be paid for out of Conservation Fund, with financial assistance from a grant by the state's Mooseplate Program.

Request for Qualifications (RFQs) have been solicited from six firms with the required experience. When received, bids will be ranked, interviews conducted, and a contract awarded. Every effort will be made to have a completed NRI in the hands of Town officials before Summer 2008.

ONE YEAR IN THE LIFE OF A COMMISSION

The Commission regularly reviews and signs off on citizen applications to the NH Department of Environmental Services (DES) to dredge and

fill and otherwise impact wetlands. There were many such cases in 2007, including clearance for the School District to build the new track facilities below Conant High School, a wetlands crossing to enable access to a new home off Parker Road, a dock permit on Gilson Pond, and a culvert crossing on Red Gate Road.

In addition, the Commission in 2007 advised and otherwise assisted Jaffrey citizens on more than 20 projects, large and small, one example entailing maintenance of The Swale in Jaffrey Center. Most of these projects involved wetlands, but some concerned ponds, roads, and trees. A particularly exciting focus of the past year has been to enhance protections on privately owned lands, including farmland and specific properties astride Sanders Road and upper Woodbury Hill Road, where the potential exists to conserve more than 1,000 acres of unfragmented land and wildlife corridors east of Thorndike Pond, including adjacent lands in Dublin and Peterborough. The Commission also finalized securing a conservation easement, to be administered by The Monadnock Conservancy, for Children's Woods in exchange for DES approval of the new baseball field's minor intrusion on wetlands bordering the Contoocook River below Blake Street. Such exchanges benefit the Town and are becoming an increasingly common means of combining needed development with the attainment of conservation goals.

A related approach is for the Commission to pay transaction costs (as for surveys and appraisals) to facilitate placing private lands in conservation easement. In 2007 the Commission assisted The Monadnock Conservancy in helping the McKelvie family to preserve more than 2,000 feet of shoreline on Frost Pond and is currently working on several other possibilities. The McKelvie easement will protect water quality while creating opportunities for public recreation.

In an example of regional cooperation, the Commission in 2007 was consulted by the Northeast Wilderness Trust concerning its Wapack Wilderness Conservation Campaign to purchase 1,400 acres along the Wapack Trail in New Ipswich and Rindge previously owned by Hampshire Country School. This purchase by the Trust is within the Quabbin (MA) to Cardigan (NH) corridor earmarked for preservation by numerous conservation groups.

Cheshire Pond Conservation Area (CPCA): Purchase and Management Plan

The most consequential use of the Conservation Fund is the outright purchase of significant conservation land. At Town Meeting in March 2007 Jaffrey citizens voted to ratify the Commission's decision to purchase 60 acres behind the northwestern shore of Cheshire Pond. Purchase, closing costs, and attorney's fees totaled circa \$180K, with most of the total coming from the Conservation Fund, supplemented by citizen donations. Benefits to the Town include securing contiguous wooded open space on the north side of downtown, complementing Children's Woods/Carey Park to the south; providing recreational opportunities close to the Town center; protecting the water quality and fish habitats of the Contoocook River and Cheshire Pond; and protecting the large aquifer underneath the CPCA on which much of the Town's water supply depends.

Since purchase, much of the Commission's attention has been devoted to developing a management plan for the new **Cheshire Pond Conservation Area (CPCA)**. Between August and November, six publicly announced meetings were held to consider options and decide on permitted and prohibited uses. To facilitate the process, the Commission hired an Antioch student intern, **Elizabeth Scotten Finn**, who researched state law, identified practices in other towns, and recruited expert testimony (notably by Jaffrey Chief of Police William Oswalt and by Sergeant Craig Morocco of NH Fish & Game). The management plan nears completion as this report goes to press. The Commission hopes to have the CPCA ready for the public's enjoyment by Spring/Summer 2008.

Children's Woods

In a related development, the Commission turned its attention to Children's Woods, thanks in large part to the enterprise of **David Edscorn**, a Jaffrey high school student and Eagle Scout candidate. David proposed – and the Commission approved – creation of new trails and signage, plus a general clean-up, in the Woods, with David and teams he organized doing the work in September/October.

The results are spectacular. The new trails will facilitate access to the Woods by the elderly and infirm, while adding to everyone's enjoyment of

this beautiful natural park so close to the downtown area. David’s accomplishment was recognized by the Selectmen in December, and the Commission was reminded that its own oversight of Children’s Woods and other Town forests needs invigoration (see below).

The project received financial support from the Commission-administered Gordon Trust Fund (a fund created by **Robert Gordon** specifically for maintenance and enhancement of Children’s Woods and Carey Park). Technical assistance, especially for the elegant new trail signs, was provided by the Jaffrey Parks and Recreation Department.

Other Activities

The Commission is proactive in staying abreast of real estate offerings affecting open space. When appropriate, the Commission discusses alternative plans for land set-asides with owners, developers, and agents. These discussions are not intended to prevent land from being developed but, rather, to explore options for incorporating conservation criteria and goals into development that is likely to occur in any event. Negotiations on two significant properties – on Dublin Road and Squantum Road – began in 2007 and will continue.

As in the past, the Commission participated in the 2007 Riverfest in June, co-sponsored two Jaffrey students to attend Wildwood Camp in Rindge, and offered advisory opinions to the Planning Board and ZBA on several applications. Individual members also served on other bodies, including the Contoocook River Advisory Committee, the Jaffrey Center Village Improvement Society, and committees established by the Planning Board to consider changes to the Jaffrey Land Use Plan. In 2007 the Commission agreed to pay the purchase price for river-identification signs for the two main bridges in Jaffrey that crosses the Contoocook River (a request by the Rivers Management Program, in cooperation with DES). The Commission used the Conservation Fund to obtain the signs.

During the past year, the Commission sponsored two public presentations of note:

- A workshop presented by **Carolyn Russell** of the NH Department of Environmental Services on “Minimizing the Impact of Development Using Conservation Subdivision Design”, held at the Meetinghouse

in May. This event was intended to assist the Planning Board's ordinance review and is part of a new effort by the Commission to reconcile development and conservation goals.

- “An Evening on Watersheds” featuring a video (“After the Storm”) prepared by the Environmental Protection Agency and the Weather Channel, held at the Jaffrey Public Library in June (co-sponsored by the Department of Public Works). This program highlighted the negative consequences to human populations of neglecting and/or abusing riparian systems.

In addition, members of the Commission attended several conferences organized by others in an on-going effort to improve the Commission's capabilities. These included, in 2007, the NH Land Conservation Coalition's meeting in Concord focusing on open space development; Saving Special Places 2007 in Londonderry addressing easements and other land protection options; the NH Association of Conservation Commissions' 37th Annual Meeting in Concord updating ConCom mandates, procedures, and opportunities; and the Municipal Law Lecture Series in Jaffrey reviewing state law and recent court rulings.

In September 2007 **Brenda Bhatti** presented a proposal to the Selectmen that the Town hire a part-time **Natural Resources/Land Use Agent** (title TBD). Jaffrey has a growing need for professional-level assistance to monitor, manage, and advise the Town on a broad range of issues, from GIS mapping and land acquisitions to site reviews and liaison with regional and state organizations. The proposal is timely given the emphasis in the Master Plan Update on environmental protection and maintaining rural character in the face of mounting pressures on both. The Commission believes that other Town boards would also benefit from such a position, and it is anticipated that much of the salary obligation associated with it would be covered by grants that the Agent would attract. This proposal is under discussion.

Finally, the Commission worked hard in 2007 to improve its own deliberation and voting procedures, expense authorizations, financial oversight, and record keeping. These improvements are intended to ensure compli-

ance with state law and otherwise increase transparency and accountability. Also in place is a new policy to share the Commission's agendas and minutes with the Planning Board, ZBA, Selectmen, and Town Manager.

LOOKING AHEAD: PRIORITIES FOR 2008

- First and foremost: Complete the Natural Resources Inventory.
- Finalize the CPCA management plan and take practical steps to make this community resource effectively available for public enjoyment.
- Upgrade oversight of Children's Woods and other Town forests. Discussions are underway with the Jaffrey Middle School to establish a student Conservation Corps to help monitor and provide remedial attention.
- Correct wetlands mapping on the Town's tax maps.
- Continue the dialogue among Town boards to assess the merit of adding a Natural Resources/Land Use Agent to the payroll.
- Explore opportunities to strengthen the Conservation Fund.
- Update and improve the Commission's website.

TRANSITIONS

The Commission experienced a significant change in personnel in 2007. After four years of extraordinary leadership, **Brenda Bhatti** resigned as Chair of the Commission at the end of June and was succeeded by **John O. Field**. Brenda continues to serve on the Commission as Treasurer and technical expert on wetlands and land preservation. Leaving the Commission in 2007 were **Birgit Johanson** and **John Zimardo**, both valued members whose many contributions will be missed. Joining the Commission were **Carolyn D. Garretson**, **William J. Graf**, and **James R. Bearce**, all of whom bring new skills that promise to enhance the Commission's capacity in the years ahead.

Report of the Contoocook and North Branch Rivers Local Advisory Committees (CNBRLAC)

This is a brief summary of our 2007 activities to protect the River as it flows north through 14 New Hampshire border towns joining the Merrimack in Concord.

RIVER QUALITY MONITORING: We continued chemical testing at specific sites from Rindge to Concord during the summer months using our new computerized electronic monitoring apparatus. In Jaffrey these sites are located at the R137 bridge and at Red Dam near R202. As in 2006, DES will analyze the data, add it to the growing computer data base and issue its report to the border towns.

CONTOOCCOOK RIVER SIGNS: DES has instituted a program utilizing attractive signs to increase public awareness of New Hampshire's "designated rivers" at points where these rivers cross well-traveled highways. The Contoocook is a river designated under RSA statute for special protection provisions among many other important rivers in the State. Jaffrey will have 2 sets of signs (coming and going). The Mill in the center of Town R202 crossing and the Bean factory crossing on R202 will be the sign locations which will be installed by DES in the spring of 2008.

DISPLAY AND POWERPOINT PROGRAM: This is an educational power-point program about the River which is available for use by town groups, civic clubs, libraries, schools or other interested groups. To see the program, contact our website at www.cnbrlac.org. Also available is a DVD of the River in four seasons set to the music of Vivaldi's Four Seasons. Contact Byron Carr of Hopkinton to obtain a copy.

BUS TOUR: We offered an educational bus tour along the entire River again this year highlighting points of special interest. We plan to make these tours an annual event.

MONTHLY MEETING ACTIVITY: The majority of our meeting time involved helping towns consider the effects of increased building of private residences and commercial development along the River and its

tributaries. Monitoring of dredge and fill applications often require our input. We monitor and report on any construction or other activity which could violate the provisions of The Shoreline Protection Act. A member of the State DES attends most of our meetings giving us updates and acting as advisor on special issues. The majority of our monthly meetings are held at the Monadnock Paper Mill in Bennington.

RIVER MANAGEMENT PLAN UPDATE: We have completed a one-page overview highlighting the purpose and provisions of the Plan. A comprehensive 10 year update is a work in progress for 2008 and is intended to be incorporated by reference into each border town's updated Master Plan which includes Jaffrey.

SPECIAL NOTE: I would welcome an interested Jaffrey citizen to join our group as a volunteer Committee member. Many of the towns have 2 reps. Contact Ron Rogstad (532-6332) for information.

A contract has been entered into for a feasibility study to be completed in early 2008 which will address the long term traffic problems in the downtown district area.

The town has entered into a contract for an engineering study to bring water into the Stone Arch Bridge area. This study is very necessary for the safety of the businesses in the area. It will provide fire protection water to all concerned. It is hoped that this project is completed in 2008.



Report of the Energy Committee

In March 2006, the Jaffrey Town Meeting voted to “ask our Selectmen to consider the appointment of a voluntary energy committee to recommend local steps to save energy and reduce emissions.” Accordingly, on June 11, 2007, the Jaffrey Board of Selectmen authorized the establishment of the Jaffrey Energy Committee, with Harry Young as its Chairman. Members of the Committee now include Dick Ames, Doug Clayton, Margaret Dillon, Ed Suprenant, Andy Jones, Bonnie Mitchell, Rob Stevenson, Douglas Starr and Harry Young. As its first order of business, the Committee has undertaken to study energy needs and patterns of energy use in Jaffrey. The Committee, acting as advisors to town officials, the schools, businesses and residents on energy matters, will seek to encourage conservation (and to save money wherever possible) through the wise use of energy, giving special attention to minimizing carbon dioxide emissions, fossil fuel dependency and wasteful energy consumption while maximizing clean renewable energy use. Among numerous critical energy challenges and opportunities, the Committee expects to:

- Reduce energy and environmental waste through smart recycling. To that end, the Committee has begun a comparative study of recycling patterns and energy use at the Jaffrey Recycling Center and at facilities operated in other towns.
- Reduce carbon and other harmful fuel emissions through hybrid and other technological innovations and through shifts from petroleum to bio-diesel, solar and other alternative energy sources. To that end, the Committee is researching the availability and advantages of bio-diesel as an alternative fuel for town and school vehicles (including the contracted school bus system) and expects to encourage and publicize in 2007 a variety of public and private sector alternative energy initiatives.
- Reduce costs of residential, commercial and town lighting through use of low energy lighting sources and good lighting management practices. To that end, the Energy Committee has recommended, and the Selectmen have recently approved, the establishment of an ad hoc Street Lighting Committee with a mandate to “study the town’s lighting to save money and reduce global warming.”
- Reduce heating and air conditioning costs in buildings by tightening building envelopes, maximizing solar gain and upgrading energy

management systems. To that end, the Committee has facilitated plans for comprehensive state-of-the-art energy audits of selected Town and school buildings, and expects to publicize both the process and results of these audits in order to foster energy savings in both the public and private sectors.

- Increase energy efficiency through reformed building and property development codes. To that end, the Committee has undertaken a review of progressive rules that have been adopted in other jurisdictions, and plans on initiating by mid-2008 discussions of options with the appropriate Town officials and boards.

Report of the Historic District Commission

The Jaffrey Historic District Commission was established by the citizens in 1969 to safeguard the heritage of Jaffrey Center by a) preserving a district that reflects elements of its cultural, social, economic, political and architectural history, b) conserving property values in the district, c) fostering civic beauty, and d) promoting the use of an historic district for the education, pleasure and welfare of the citizens.

In the year 2007, your Historic District Commission met 5 times to discuss business relating to the Commission's ordinance to "regulate the construction, alteration, painting, moving, demolition, or use of the structures and places" within the district. During the year no formal applications were filed.

The Commission would like to extend its sincere thanks to the residents and neighbors of the District for cooperating and considering the impact any changes to their houses might have on the overall character of the Historic District.

The Commission has expanded its focus from just the Jaffrey Center Historic District to the town as a whole through Jaffrey's participation in the Certified Local Government (CLG) program, a nationwide effort of the National Park Service that is administered by the NH Division of Historical Resources in Concord. Preservation Consultant, Elizabeth Durfee Hengen and Roger Hawk continued the work initiated with the 2006 grant on the historical resources and a review of Jaffrey's related ordinances. An application for a 2007 grant was made and received for the creation of a web-based historical and cultural resources interactive database for the Town of Jaffrey.

The fencing design and implementation for Centennial Park in Jaffrey Center was completed.

The Commission cosponsored the annual event of a reading of the Declaration of Independence on July 4th at the Meetinghouse which was well attended by Jaffrey residents as well as many people from surrounding towns.

The Commission would like to thank the Selectmen's Meetinghouse Committee for the continuing coordination and ongoing restoration of the Meetinghouse.

All residents are reminded that the Historic District Commission's regular monthly meetings are held on the first Thursday of the month at 7pm. Winter meetings are in the Town Office; summer meetings are in the Meetinghouse.

Report of the Library Trustees

In 2007 the library continued to respond to changes we have been seeing in the usage of our collections. While book circulation remained somewhat flat, the circulation of audio visual material and the use of the public access internet increased dramatically. In an effort to encourage reading in our younger users, the library contacted area daycare providers to offer our resources and services. This effort resulted in increased visits to and by these daycare groups. The number of class visits from Jaffrey Grade School also grew from 89 to 114 in 2007.

The annual Summer Reading Program encouraged kids to “Catch the Reading Bug. Readers and listener totaling 134 kids caught the bug and also enjoyed great craft programs and special events during the summer months.

Recorded books continued to be our most popular collection. We purchased new titles monthly and this year we also joined the Downloadable Audio Program offered through the NH State Library. This program allows anyone with a Jaffrey library card the ability to download audio books to a computer, transfer them to an MP3 player or burn selected titles to CDs. There are thousands of titles and it’s free with your library card. The web site is <http://nh.lib.overdrive.com>.

Throughout 2007, the Friends of the Library helped us by fund raising and by sponsoring various speakers, educational events, and the Summer Reading Program. This year they presented two historical interactive performances, one featuring Eleanor Roosevelt and the other presenting Sara Josepha Hale, the proponent of Thanksgiving as a national holiday and the author of “Mary had a little lamb”. Both the Womans’ Club and the Historical Society assisted in sponsoring these programs. Similar programs are planned for 2008. Our film series and our spring and fall book groups continue to draw crowds.

We continue to work with the Recreation Department by providing monthly craft programs to the AFTER program. We have also increased our deposits of material to Good Shepherd Nursing and Rehabilitation Center to twice a month.

Finally, as the result of a survey taken in the Fall, we have changed the library hours. We will be open earlier in the mornings and an hour later on Saturdays. The new hours which started Jan. 1, 2008 are Mon. & Wed. 10-5:30, Tues. & Thurs. 1-7:30, Fri. 10-4:30 and Sat. 10-2.

During the year, we receive many gifts and donations from community organizations and individuals. These gifts help us to add to our collection and expand our resources and we thank the community for their generosity.

In 2008, we look forward to providing you with service that meets your needs and we thank you for your support.

THE MEETINGHOUSE COMMITTEE advises the Town on matters pertaining to the use and maintenance of Jaffrey's historic Meetinghouse.

The Meetinghouse served as a venue for many events between May and October: Amos Fortune Forum (seven free lectures), Monadnock Music (one free concert), Downtown Concerts (several relocations due to rain), Conant High School's 15th annual Shakespeare Festival, the 91st annual First Church Fair, and one wedding and one memorial service. Several Town boards and committees met in the Meetinghouse one or more times, including the Board of Selectmen, Conservation Commission, Cemetery Committee, the Planning Board's Water & Sewer Committee and the Historic District Commission. The Jaffrey-Rindge School Board held its June 25th meeting at the Meetinghouse, a first as far as one can tell. (Conant High School was first located in the Meetinghouse.) The Committee hopes the Board will come back annually or from time-to-time. The Meetinghouse was the scene of numerous other meetings, school group visits, historical society tours, a contra dance and other gatherings throughout the year. The Committee along with the Jaffrey Historical Society, the Village Improvement Society and the Historic District Commission cosponsored the 7th annual reading of The Declaration of Independence on the 4th of July. The Meetinghouse was again full and the 38 volunteer readers did a marvelous job. All are invited to attend and participate. That evening the Keene Legion Band relocated its concert to the Meetinghouse due to rain.

The Committee made thorough inspections of the Meetinghouse on May 21st and October 17th. Between the two dates a variety of projects were undertaken, sometimes by members of the Committee and at other times by volunteers or contractors: Inspection and servicing of the Town clock (largely done by Charles Marvin); annual testing of the fire alarm system; and the usual touch-up interior painting. Twelve more bench cushions were donated by the Village Improvement Society.

For the second year in a row a Christmas tree was installed on the Common and a lighting ceremony with caroling was held on December 9th.

The three major projects in 2007 were the exterior painting of the south façade and the east stairs and bulkhead, and the interior painting of the north wall and underside of the gallery on the first floor. This was carried out by Wright Painting of Jaffrey. No major projects are planned for 2008. The East façade will probably need painting in 2009.

The calendar for next season is beginning to fill. Other than the usual events, five weddings have already been booked. The Jaffrey Historical Society will present a public program on the evening of August 12th in celebration of its 50th anniversary. These and other private gatherings benefit the Town through rental fees.

Report of the Monadnock Advisory Commission

The Monadnock Advisory Commission was created by State Statute and is charged to advise and guide the Department of Resources and Economic Development on the management of State lands on Monadnock, Gap and Little Monadnock Mountains.

The Commission voted to allow and support an ecological research project on Monadnock by Antioch University. Headed by Peter Palmietto, a Forest Ecologist, the project goals are to research and inventory plant communities and ecosystems, and study the long term effects of climate; then to communicate these findings to the public. This will be an ongoing project to gain substantial scientific information.

The new Dublin Trailhead parking lot and trailhead relocation have been completed, as a result of a multi-year effort between SPNHF, New England Forestry Foundation, NH Parks and the Town of Dublin. Information kiosks and a portable toilet have been installed.

Iron Rangers have been installed by the Division of Parks and SPNHF cooperatively at the following trailheads: Dublin, Old Toll Road, North and South Gap Mountain, Rhododendron State Park, and Monadnock State Park headquarters. These are signed to accept required fees or donations with explanation as to how the money is to be used. Iron Rangers have been successful in acquiring revenue when no staff is present.

The Jaffrey Planning Board approved a lot line adjustment to SPNHF for its Poole Lot, which will allow for a land swap for the State Gay Lot. This is as proposed in the Monadnock Master Plan.

Monadnock State Park Manager Andrew Zboray reported annual day use attendance at 70,638 at headquarters, 11,214 at other trailheads, campers at 9,084.

Report of the Planning Board

A total of 17 applications were submitted to the Planning Board during 2007:

A. Site Plan Reviews – 5 site plan review applications were submitted. (4 were granted and 1 was not accepted).

B. Subdivisions – 12 total subdivision applications were submitted; 2 Major (1 was granted and 1 was withdrawn), 6 Minor (5 were granted and 1 is pending), and 4 Technical (all were granted).

C. Note there were also a Compliance Hearing and a Public Deliberative Session.

The number of applications before the Planning Board was down 26% from the 2006 year. This continuing downward trend reflects the slow downs being experienced in the new construction and real estate segments of our economy.

The decrease in applications does not reflect the activity of your Planning Board. Your Planning Board met in Public Session 19 times during 2007; there were also many committee meetings in which members participated. Completion and implementation of the Master Plan update accounts for this increase in activity. After finalization and acceptance of the Master Plan, the Planning Board identified the top priorities from the Implementation Section. From this list, the Planning Board established Master Plan Extension Committees to work on the top 4 priorities. These committees (Rural Character, Water and Sewer, Open Space Development Plans, and Mountain Zone) worked for the next 4-6 months to develop proposed ordinance changes. These changes were reviewed at Public Hearings and will be voted on at the March 11, 2008 ballot.

Report of the Town Manager

The year 2007 opened with Town Manager Jonathan Sistare continuing his tour of duty in Iraq.

Many of the challenges faced by the Town in 2006 continued into 2007. The most challenging issue was the construction of a new wastewater treatment facility. This project did not receive voter approval in a Special Town Meeting in September 2006. Since that defeat, the Town was charged with reassessing the design of the facility ensuring the most cost efficient and effective design for reconsideration of the voters at the March 2007 Town Meeting. Additionally, the Town was also charged to investigate other alternatives to constructing a new facility. The Town and its consultants worked diligently to address these concerns. This delay, in retrospect, was a good thing for the Town.

This delay allowed the Town to readvertise the project and receive multiple bids for the project, ensuring a competitive bid and also permitted the Town adequate time to finalize application to the US Department of Commerce for an Economic Development Administration (EDA) grant. The project received voter approval at the March Town Meeting. Shortly after Town Meeting, the Town was notified that we would be receiving a \$2 Million grant for the wastewater treatment facility. This was great news. Had the project been under construction, it was possible that the project would have been ineligible for this funding program. Additional excellent news arrived in December where the Town received notification of an additional \$295,320 Federal grant through a special appropriation for Jaffrey. These two grants could not have been realized without the efforts of our elected representatives, especially Senator Sununu and his staff. The EDA grant was supported by Millipore which was also instrumental in the Town receiving this grant. We will continue to pursue all funding avenues to obtain additional grant funding for this project.

Work continued this year addressing the drinking water issues facing the town. The redundant well adjacent to the Turnpike production well was substantially completed. The pumping rate at the Contoocook well was incrementally increased to increase the water available from this source. Additionally, the voters approved at the March Town Meeting

authorization to purchase property on Squantum Road as a potential well site. Preliminary evaluation is encouraging with continued analysis underway. Water main replacement work continued.

The Town experienced significant improvements to the downtown area. Work on the renovation of the Jaffrey Mill west building was completed with residents occupying the space by year's end. This project was realized with the assistance of the Town receiving Community Development Block Grant funding toward the rehabilitation. The Jaffrey Mill east building is also under significant renovation into 12 market rate condominiums. Additional improvements to the downtown area included the installation of concrete sidewalks with compliant disability access ramps replacing the blacktop sidewalks. This project was realized through an 80/20 grant from the New Hampshire Department of Transportation. Work at the community field continued this past year. This facility continues to be made possible through the generous efforts of Robert Van Dyke and numerous volunteers with coordination and assistance provided by the Recreation Department. Team Jaffrey also continued with their successful programs such as River Fest, Concerts on the Common and beautification projects throughout the seasons. The Jaffrey Chamber of Commerce donated and installed with assistance from the Town beautiful new "Welcome to Jaffrey" signage at each gateway into the town. These community functions are often overlooked or taken for granted but are truly assets to the Town.

In August, the Town received notification that Jonathan Sistare would not be returning to Jaffrey as its Town Manager upon his return from active duty. Through his fourteen years of service to the town, Jonathan was a fair and competent Manager that earned the support and respect of his Department Heads. I personally will miss working under Jonathan's tutelage and wish him the best in his future endeavors.

With the news of Jonathan not returning to the Town, the Selectmen advertised, interviewed and offered the position of Town Manager to Michael Hartman. I welcome Mike to Jaffrey and am certain he will serve the Town well and quickly will realize what a great Town Jaffrey is.

Other staff changes that occurred within the Town were: William "Bill" Oswalt was appointed Chief of Police, Mary Drew was hired as Welfare

Director, and Brandon Gray, Grants Administrator, resigned from the Town in 2007.

At this time I would like to thank the Board of Selectmen, Town Moderator Marc Tieger, fellow employees especially Sue Richard and Pam Bernier as well as other staff at the Town Office for their invaluable assistance provided to me in this temporary position. Additionally, I would like to express my sincere appreciation to the many residents of Town who provided kind words of support.

Report of the Overseer of Public Welfare

The year 2007 saw several increases in expenditures over 2006. Many factors play a significant role in our most expensive year to date.

Housing and shelter costs were up over 2006 figures by \$17,521.71. Of the total costs for shelter, \$8,944.20 was for out-of-town homeless shelter payments and in-town hotels. The crashing housing market and lack of decent paying jobs contributed to several households who faced foreclosure and eviction. Additionally, the overwhelming increase in fuel oil, created a large number of requests for fuel assistance as households were forced to choose between paying for rent, paying for heat, or buying groceries. An increased number of applicants came in with long-term illnesses, new injuries, new diagnoses, terminal diseases, and permanent disabilities, all facing these challenges without medical insurance.

Larger numbers than ever are seeking assistance as 2-income families become 1-income families or no income families due to divorce, separation, domestic violence, abandonment, employment layoffs, and position terminations. Partners of substance and alcohol abusers are asking for assistance with rent and food, as their living situations deteriorate out of their control. Also on the rise are the numbers of absentee parents not paying child support, leaving many low-skilled, one-parent families seeking assistance to stay in their homes.

A tragic fire on May 11, 2007 left 21 people homeless. The Town of Jaffrey disbursed \$5,873.00 to the survivors of the fire, to go towards security deposits for new apartments, to replace household furnishings, and for food and clothing.

So is there any good news?

A new Jaffrey non-profit, *Shelter From the Storm*, is helping to minimize sheltering costs to the town by providing long-term, supportive shelter to Jaffrey residents, with intensive case management and appropriate service referrals.

The River Center in Peterborough, is asking several towns to get involved with its public transportation initiative, *Contoocook Valley Transportation Cooperative*, which will offer rides for citizens to and from work, medical appointments, shopping, and school. For information on the program and volunteering, please call 924-6800.

General Assistance recipients will now be required to meet with a financial advisor should their individual situation warrant the extra help. There will be mandatory financial education workshops exploring money management, prioritizing bills, earned income tax credits, and homeownership opportunities. In 2007, several families met with retired financial analyst, Larry Swartz, who kindly volunteers his time helping others get and stay out of debt, and with great success.

If you find yourself struggling to make ends meet, please call the welfare department before things get out of control. We are here to help each other, and the earlier you ask for help, the sooner we can find a solution.

Report of the Public Works Department

Cemeteries/Parks and Commons Division: In 2007, the Town performed 21 full-body and cremation burials. The staff assisted and participated with the Cemetery Committee by attending regular meetings and began to implement a cemetery records database for existing and new burials. Staff also assisted the Committee with continuing work on the Cutter Cemetery expansion and assisted with the rehabilitation of the Conant Cemetery fence... A cemetery cleanup day was held on November 29th to remove materials from gravesites that do not comply with the regulations and improve the general appearance of the facilities. The Town continued contracting out landscaping maintenance activities to a private contractor. Improvements were made and the fire sprinkler system inspected and tested at the Jaffrey Center Storage Building (formerly Jaffrey Center Fire Station).

Highway Division: The Highway Department reconstructed or resurfaced almost two miles of roadways in 2007. Full reconstruction did occur on Thorndike Pond Road (from Route 124 to Gilson Road) including that portion of the road where the water main was replaced and a portion of Laban Ainsworth Way and Gilmore Pond Road (Adams Street to Lambert Farm). A 655 foot portion of the gravel section of Old Sharon Road was upgraded to a paved road. Final paving of River Street was accomplished following the water main replacement project that was substantially completed in 2006. Heath Road does continue to be an area of concern where the 6' culvert under the roadway has been unable to handle the flow and water during past flooding events and was very close to overtopping the roadway. The Town received notification that a hazard mitigation grant would be forthcoming from the New Hampshire Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management to add a culvert capable of handling additional water during flooding and protecting the road. The pipe was purchased and the project is planned for completion in 2008. The Town received biennial bridge inspection report from NHDOT and no deficiencies were listed and all posting signs were replaced where necessary. Downtown sidewalks were replaced and granite curbing reset or replaced as a result of a grant from NHDOT for pedestrian improvements. In addition to the above projects, the Highway Crews performed winter and summer (seasonal) maintenance on over 64 miles of Town roads (including 20 miles of gravel road). The highway crew assisted other Departments throughout the year including the Water, Sewer, Recreation, Fire and Police. Senior Equipment Operator Bruce Hautanen was recognized by the

Board of Selectmen for 30 years of service to the Town. The Mechanic with assistance from Highway staff, maintained and kept operational the Town's vehicles and in addition to maintaining highway vehicles, over 240 hours of labor was expended maintaining Fire, Police, Water, Sewer, and Recreation Department vehicles and equipment. The Highway Division also took delivery of a new 6-wheel dump truck with new plow and spreader assemblies, a new 1-ton dump truck, and used roller all approved at the 2007 Town Meeting.

Wastewater Division: The wastewater treatment plant processed approximately 186,807,000 gallons (average 511,800 gallons per day) of wastewater in 2007. Aquarion Operating Services (United Water Company) of Auburn, NH are in the third year of a three year contract for operation of the sewer facilities including the wastewater treatment plant, Hadley Road head works, pump stations and 15 miles of collection sewer. As part of their normal operations, Aquarion completed cleaning of approximately 23,200 linear feet (4.4 miles) of collection sewer and inspected 32 manholes. This was the third year of a three (3) year program addressing a third of the sanitary sewer collection system each year. During 2007, there were 9 callouts for sewer related problems (blockages or overflows). The Public Works Department in conjunction with Insituform Technologies, video inspected and cleaned sanitary sewer on River Street, Gilmore Pond Road and portions of Main Street (Jaffrey Center), identified deficiencies and made recommendations for future rehabilitation utilizing a "trench less" cure-in-place liner system. This system provides a rehabilitated pipe more cost effectively than using the conventional dig and replace method. One such project was carried out on a section of sewer on Main Street in Jaffrey Center. There still remains significant inflow and infiltration (I/I) in the sewer collection system and we will continue to address extraneous I/I as it will become expensive to treat especially once the new facility is on-line.

The Town continued working towards compliance with an Administrative Order originally issued by EPA in 2004 and amended in February, 2006 requiring the town to comply with stringent effluent standards and more restrictive NPDES permit limits by completing a significant upgrade to our treatment system. To comply with the Order, the town designed an advanced treatment facility and originally advertised the project for construction and received bids in July, 2006 and presented the project at a Special Town Meeting held on September 9, 2006. However the project failed to receive the necessary two-thirds vote and following the Special Town Meeting, the EPA allowed the town to proceed with another vote

at the March, 2007 Town Meeting. In the meantime, town staff and its consultant completed a detailed review of construction documents and operational and maintenance costs to identify areas where costs could be reduced. In addition town staff and its consultant also evaluated alternative systems (including de-centralized and land disposal) that were discussed at the Special Town Meeting and retained a consultant to conduct a socio-economic study evaluating financial impacts of the project on the community. The project was advertised again and competitive bids were received from three qualified contractors. The project was approved at the March Town Meeting. The project was awarded to Penta Corporation (Moultonborough, NH) and construction began in June, 2007. It is expected that construction will be complete and the new treatment plant on-line by May, 2009. In August, 2007, the Town was extremely fortunate to receive a \$ 2,000,000 grant from the Economic Development Administration (EDA) through the efforts of Senator John Sununu and his staff. In December, the Town learned that our elected officials secured an additional \$ 295,000 in funds to be appropriated in the 2008 Federal budget. The grant and additional funds plus the 30% State of New Hampshire construction grant will help defray the construction costs of the new facility.

Water Division: The Department produced approximately 140,926,000 gallons (average 386,099 gallons per day) from two groundwater wells and provided potable drinking water and fire protection to approximately 1,530 accounts in Jaffrey and Rindge. Hydrant repair and replacement continued with the replacement and/or addition of eight new (8) fire hydrants. Hydrants were flushed twice during the year (spring and fall). Three hundred and sixty-two (362) residential and commercial water meters were installed or replaced and an additional seventy-seven (77) radio read units were replaced or upgraded. Also, the Water Department took delivery of a mobile mounted radio read unit which allows all water meters to be read from a Water Department vehicle rather than walking house to house which will increase the meter reading efficiency. The water mains on Thorndike Pond Road, Blackberry Lane and Meetinghouse Road were replaced by town forces (Water and Highway Departments). The project included replacement of 2,800 linear feet of old cast iron water main with 8" ductile iron pipe, three (3) fire hydrants and renewal of all water services. In conjunction with the Highway Department, Thorndike Pond Road was reconstructed and paved.

Since 2005, work has progressed on the optimization of the existing water supply including the addition of a redundant well at the Turnpike Well and improvements to the Turnpike Well House. As reported last

year, in 2006, we received DES approval to increase the Contoocook Well pumping rate and have been doing so relying on Contoocook to provide almost 70% of the town's water. The chlorinator units utilized for disinfection were replaced at both the Turnpike and Contoocook wells and the Water Department's SCADA system was upgraded. As approved at last year's Town Meeting, the Town acquired a parcel on Squantum Road from the Virginia Pond Trust and is currently working the necessary permits to develop this location as an additional water source.

Engineering Division: In 2007, the Town Engineer continued as Acting Public Works Director until November when Randall Heglin returned to the Department after serving as Acting Town Manager since May, 2006. The engineer provided assistance to all Department of Public Works functions as well as other town departments. The engineer also oversaw the construction management of the upgraded wastewater treatment plant, water system improvements and downtown pedestrian improvements. Support was provided to the Planning Board as needed by reviewing site and subdivision plans, inspecting development projects, and preparing bond recommendations. The Engineer is also coordinating the activities related to the development of the additional water source (Virginia Pond Trust property on Squantum Road acquired by the Town). The Engineer also coordinated dam inspections by DES with specific recommendations incorporated into the Town's Capital Improvement Plan. Revisions to the Town's Sewer Use Ordinance and Local Limits were approved by EPA and NHDES and will be presented to the Board of Selectmen for adoption in early 2008.

Solid Waste/Transfer/Recycling Division: Material received and processed at the Transfer Station in 2007 included the following approximate amounts: 912 tons compactor waste, 552 tons bulky waste including construction and demolition debris, 187 tons recycled material (plastics, paper, corrugated), and 113 tons light iron, 4.75 tons of aluminum, 199 televisions, 109 computer monitors and 51 microwaves, 3 trailer loads of tires (about 8,325 tires), 16 propane tanks, 2.78 tons of batteries, and 87 Freon containing items.

The Department continues to address operational and environmental recommendations presented by the Board of Selectmen's citizen advisory committee three years ago. Plans to cover and improve the bulky waste drop off area and replace and insulate the transfer station roof are incorporated in the Town's Capital Improvement Plan. In 2007, through the efforts of the Northeast Resource Recovery Association (NRRA) we were able to swap balers with another community which provided us with a bet-

ter and more efficient baler for recycled plastics.

The issue of dump stickers remains a sensitive issue for many folks. The staff is checking for valid stickers and while most residents are cooperative and respectful, we occasionally have unpleasant experiences.

We continue to process commodities through the NRRR, which competitively bids commodities and insures the best prices for their members. Following is a summary of the materials processed at the Transfer Station:

Robert Conroy designed and built an information station for the Rails to Trails entrance on Stratton Road. The station was completed in time for the summer, and contains useful information relating to the trail and other recreational opportunities in the community. David Edscorn is working on a project in Children’s Woods to provide signage and trail improvements in the area. David’s project is nearly complete. Both young men should reach their Eagle Scout rank in 2008. We are proud to be a part of their efforts.

Another visible project completed in 2007 was the refurbishing of the Community Bulletin Board that once stood downtown. Our A.F.T.E.R. School Coordinator, Karen Morris, has provided programs for Middle School Students throughout the school year. Some of her programs include crafts, sledding, skating, movie theatres, hiking, and community service.



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
Incorporated: 1773

Origin: In 1749 this territory was chartered as Monadnock Number 2, sometimes called Middle Monadnock or Middletown. It was one of the first towns established under the New Hampshire proprietors' purchase of undivided lands under the Masonian claim. The grant was renewed in 1767, and the town incorporated in 1773 as Jaffrey, in honor of George Jaffrey, member of a prominent Portsmouth family. Both his father and son were named George, and all three served as treasurer of the province. George Senior held the position when the state was still under Massachusetts rule. George III also served as proprietors' clerk, and was a life trustee of Dartmouth College, providing the design for the official college seal.


